Indian Wild Boar



Let me first tell you about him..

The snout is one of its most defining features. The structure of the snout and skull is well suited for digging.

Family : Suidae

Scientific Name : Sus scrofa cristatus

The canine teeth are modified into tusks that protrude from the adult's mouth. The bottom tusk is longer and sharper. Upper tusk is only present in the males used when they fight during the breeding season.

Their colours can be brown, black, red or dark grey depending on the location.

Distribution:

- The Wild Boar (Sus scrofa) are Native of European forests, north-west Africa and Asia.
- Also introduced to Americas and Australia too, thus making it one of the widest ranging mammals in the animal kingdom.



Classification:

- Around 16 sub species of Sus scrofa (Wild boar) are recognised and grouped into four regional groupings.
- The Indian boar (Sus scrofa cristatus) is a subspecies native to Indian subcontinent, Burma and Western Thailand.

Habitat:

- known to reside in a variety of habitats including tropical forests and grasslands, but they tend to favour deciduous broad-leaf forests with dense vegetation, streams, marshes.
- -In India they are also found in agricultural and open landscapes near human inhabitations.

Social life:

Female dominated sounders (herd of wild boar) led by an old matriarch.



Barren sows (females only)

Mother with young one

Adult males are solitary except the breeding season.

Females either remain with their mothers or establish new territories nearby. During breeding season, males travel long distances in search of a sounder of sows. The male fiercely fights potential rivals during breeding season and also gets injured.

Highly versatile omnivore comparable to humans.


