Mid Career Training (MCT) Programme for IFS Officers
Phase-I (2nd) Course

04th to 30th September, 2017

Indira Gandhi National Forest Academy is organizing mandatory Phase – I Mid Career Training (MCT) Programme for IFS officers with 7 – 9 years of seniority and backlog candidates of other senior batches. The programme is meant for IFS officers of 2008 to 2010 batches and backlog category of senior batches is held from **04th to 30th September, 2017**.

2. Objective: - The main objective of the training is to build upon the field exposure and experience gained by the officers in the initial years of their service and help them to improve their personal performance levels. The officer shall get an opportunity to test the validity of their academic learning and to gather new skills and knowledge for applying at workplace for professional management skills in the context of the emerging scenario in the field of forestry and environment. The objective shall be met out by exposing the officers on various modules of the training programme, as per the schedule given below.

3. Mandatory nature: - The Indian Forest Service (Pay) Rules have been revised vide notification no. 20011/1/2006-AIS-II dated 21.02.2008 and its amendment through IFS (Pay) Second Amendment Rule, 2008 vide notification no 14021/3/2008-AIS-II dated 27.09.2008, to make the MCT programmes compulsory for award of Junior Administrative grade, IInd Super time scale and further increments respectively to the concerned officers. Therefore, it would be the responsibility of the concerned State Government and the officer him/herself to be in a position to attend the programme as per the schedule.

4. Out line of the course: - The programme has been designed with great care based on scientifically assessed training needs of the IFS officers of 7 – 9 years of seniority.

4.1. Management Module: - The first week of the programme is set aside to hone the managerial skills of the officers through experts from national level reputed agencies and institutions. The Negotiation Skills, conflict management, leadership skill, Stress management, Financial management, Competency based personnel management in HRD, Creation of enabling environment, Good Governance are main focal area of the management module which is organised in IGNFA Dehradun. The schedule of the management module is placed at **Annexure I.**

4.2. Line Ministries Attachment:- In the second week, the participants would be staying in Delhi and visit various central government ministries and other institutions like National Green Tribunal, Central Zoo Authority, Central Pollution Control Board etc. The aim is to appreciate the line ministries working and possibility of synergy and interact with senior officers of convergence in forest working in the allied sectors. The schedule for the second week of the programme is placed at **Annexure II.**

4.3 Thematic Tour: - the participants would be taken on Thematic tours covering aspects on Wildlife Management, Ecotourism, Coastal, Marine and Wet Land Resources Management, NTFP and Forest Corporation Management. For the purpose of Thematic tours, the IGNFA has made similar group of officers based on their preference as well as by following a lottery system to ensure equal distribution of officers for various themes as per the MoEF&CC guidelines. In the thematic tour, the officers shall get a chance to visit best practices in the theme allotted to them and to interact from field officers. There will be group presentation followed by the tour at IGNFA. The groups will also submit a group report. Both presentation & group report will be assessed as part of evaluation of participants. The thematic group wise list of officers and travel plan is placed at **Annexure III.**

4.4. Forestry Module: - The final week will be held in IGNFA focusing on themes like emerging Forestry issues, environment, forest law & management, Climate Change, Wildlife Management & strategies. Best subject matter specialists on various themes are invited for the programme from all over India to deliver lecture and interact with participants. The schedule of the forestry module is placed at **Annexure IV**.

5. Evaluation of participants: - During the course, the performance of the participants in terms of their conduct, effective participation in the training programme, completion of mandatory components of the training etc. would be closely monitored and evaluated by the Academy. Appropriate grading based on their performance will be awarded.

6. Training methodology: - The training methodology adopted in the training programme shall cover a range of methods such as Lectures, Case Studies, Syndicate Work, Films, Mock exercises, demos, Field visits and hands on activity etc. The participants are encouraged to share their experience in relevant sessions and contribute by brain storming.

7. Attendance: - **90%** attendance compulsory in Management and IGNFA modules and **100%** attendance compulsory in tour/line ministries attachment components. The participants should get prior permission to remain absent during the training period. The leave shall be granted only on exceptional grounds by the Director IGNFA.

8. Performance assessment: - Performance assessment shall be done on following pattern.

- 35 marks for participant's presentation/group presentation on best practices thematic tour
- 20 marks for group report
- 20 marks for active class room interactions and contributions
- 25 marks for conduct to be assessed by the Director IGNFA

9. Grading: - Based on the marks scored, the following grades shall be awarded to the participants. The decimals of the awarded marks shall be counted towards the next higher number to fit in the grades.

- A+ grade for marks above 90
- A grade for 81 – 90 marks
- B grade for 71 – 80 marks
- C grade for 70 and below marks

11. Logistics and Other Requirements for the course: - The programme would be completely residential and boarding facilities would be arranged by IGNFA at all places. All travel arrangements during the course would be made by IGNFA, except for the journeys to be made by the participants for reporting and departure from the Academy. No allowances of any kind will be paid by IGNFA during their stay.

The participants are requested to get themselves acquaint about the weather of places that will be visited in the programme and travel with proper gear. Since the officers may likely to call on ministers, senior officer & dignitaries during the course of the programme, they are requested to bring formal dress to suit the occasions.

The participant's rooms would be equipped with desktop computers; still they are advised to carry their laptops for outdoor use.

During the programme, the participants will be provided with single accommodation at IGNFA and as per eligibility during tour outside IGNFA. No

circumstances, the family members would be allowed to accompany during the entire training programme including tours.

Officers should not carry any liability during the period of 04th to 30th September, 2017 for absenting from the training. Any absence from the programme without prior permission of the Director IGNFA shall be viewed seriously and such officers may be discharged from the training and reverted back to their cadre. Their MCT programme shall be treated as incomplete and appropriate recommendation shall be made to their Government/Organization.

12. Other aspects: - IGNFA has arranged for Yoga classes for the officers during the first week and last week of the training programme in the old mess. All the officers must attend this programme.

The participants are encouraged to use the sports, library facility of the Academy and medical facility available from FRI hospital on need basis. Key contacts list is provided at **Annexure V** of this booklet.

The programme will be over by 30th September, 2017 at 5.30 PM and the participants would be relieved from IGNFA to report to their concerned states / organizations.
