Mid Career Training (MCT) Programme for IFS Officers <u>Phase-II (3rd) Course</u>

03rd to 29th July, 2017

Indira Gandhi National Forest Academy is organizing mandatory Phase – II Mid Career Training (MCT) Programme for IFS officers with 14-16 years of seniority and backlog candidates of other senior batches. This programme is meant for IFS officers of 2000 to 2003 batches and backlog category of senior batches is held from **03rd to 29th July, 2017.**

2. <u>Objective</u>: - The main objective of the training is to build upon the field exposure and experiences gained by the officer in their service and help them to improve their performance levels. The officer shall get an opportunity to test the validity of their learnings and to gather new skills and knowledge for applying at their workplace. The objective shall be met out by exposing the officers on various modules of the training program, as per the schedule given below.

3. <u>Mandatory nature</u>: - The Indian Forest Service (Pay) Rules have been revised vide notification no. 20011/1/2006-AIS-II dated 21.02.2008 and its amendment through IFS (Pay) Second Amendment Rule, 2008 vide notification no 14021/3/2008-AIS-II dated 27.09.2008, to make the MCT programmes compulsory for award of Junior Administrative grade, IInd Super time scale and further increments respectively to the concerned officers. Therefore, it would be the responsibility of the concerned State Government and the officer him/herself to be in a position to attend the programme as per the schedule.

4. <u>Out line of the course</u>: - The programme has been designed with great care based on scientifically assessed training needs of the IFS officers of 14-16 years of seniority.

4.1. <u>Management Module</u>: - The first week of the program is set aside to horn the managerial skills of the officers through experts from national level reputed agencies and institutions. The Negotiation Skills, conflict management, leadership skill, Stress management, Financial management, Competency based personnel management in HRD, Creation of enabling environment, Good Governance are main focal area of the management module which is organised in IGNFA Dehradun. The schedule of the management module is placed at **Annexure I.**

4.2. <u>Line Ministries Attachment</u>:- In the second week, the participants would be staying in Delhi and visit & interact with the various central government ministries and other institutions like National Green Tribunal, Central Zoo Authority, Central Pollution Control Board etc; to appreciate the line ministries working and possibility of synergy and convergence in forest working in the allied sectors. The schedule for the second week of the program is placed at **Annexure II.**

4.3 <u>Overseas Module: -</u> In the third week, the officers shall embark on a visit to Russia and Finland to study the best forestry practices followed in the respective countries on the themes such as Sustainable Forest Management, Environmental Management and Climate Change, Wildlife Conservation and PA Management, Ecotourism, Watershed Management, Forest Policy and Governance Issues and Wet Land and Coastal Resource Management etc. This module is blended with sufficient theoretical and practical inputs to enable the officers to understand the practices followed in their overseas module from context and applicability perspective to Indian scenario. A detailed schedule for overseas module showing the travel plan, daily program and practical information is placed at **Annexure-III** with participants list for Russia and Finland.

4.4. Forestry Module: - The final week will be held in IGNFA focusing on emerging Forestry issues, landscape based ecosystem management, media management, biodiversity and environment conservation issues and overseas module symposium. Best subject matter specialists on various themes are invited for the program from all over India. The forestry module is theme based

one and each day will be dedicated to one theme and various aspects of it will be deliberated upon. The schedule of the forestry module is placed at **Annexure IV.**

5. <u>Evaluation of participants</u>: - During the course, the performance of the participants in terms of their conduct, effective participation in the training program, completion of mandatory components of the training etc. would be closely monitored and evaluated by the Academy. Appropriate grading on their performance will be awarded and the informed to their concerned government and MoEF&CC.

6. <u>Training methodology</u>: - The training methodology adopted in the training program shall cover a range of methods such as Lectures, Case Studies, Syndicate Work, Films, Mock exercises, Field visits and hands on activity. The participants are encouraged to share their experience in relevant sessions and contribute by brain storming.

7. <u>Attendance</u>: - 90% attendance compulsory in Management and IGNFA modules and 100% attendance compulsory in tour/line ministries attachment components. The participants should get prior permission to absent from the training. The leave shall be granted only on medical grounds by the Director IGNFA.

8. <u>Performance assessment</u>: - Performance assessment shall be done on following pattern.

- 35 marks for participant's presentation/group presentation on overseas module
- 20 Marks for Group report
- 20 marks for active class room interactions and contributions
- 25 mark for conduct to be assessed by the Director IGNFA

9. <u>**Grading:**</u> - Based on the marks scored, the following grades shall be awarded to the participants. The decimals of the awarded marks shall be counted towards the next higher number to fit in the grades.

- A+ grade for marks above 90
- A grade for 81- 90 marks
- B grade for 71- 80 marks
- C grade for 70 and below

11. <u>Logistics and Other Requirements for the course</u>: - The programme would be completely residential and boarding facilities would be arranged by IGNFA at all places, excluding the boarding facility Overseas Module. All travel arrangements during the course would be made by IGNFA, except for the journeys to be made by the participants for reporting and departure from the Academy.

The participants are requested to get themselves acquaint about the weather of places that will be visited in the program and travel with proper gear. Since the officers may likely to call on ministers, senior officer & dignitaries during the course of the program, they are requested to bring formal dress to suit the occasions.

The participant's rooms would be equipped with desktop computers; still they are advised to carry their laptops for outdoor use.

During the programme, the participants will be provided single accommodation and under no circumstances, the family members would be allowed to accompany during the entire training programme including tours.

Officers should not carry any liability during the period of 03rd to 29th July, 2017 for absenting from the training. Any absence from the program without prior permission of the Director IGNFA shall be viewed seriously and such officers may be discharged from the training and reverted back to their cadre. Their MCT program shall be treated as incomplete and appropriate recommendation shall be to their Government/Organization.

12. <u>Other aspects</u>: - IGNFA has arranged for Yoga classes for the officers during the first week and last week of the training program in the badminton hall near old mess. All the officers must attend this program.

The participants are encouraged to use the sports, library facility of the Academy and medical facility available from FRI hospital on need basis. Key contacts list is provided at **Annexure V** of this booklet.

The program will be over by 29^{th} July, 2017 at 5.30 PM and the participants would be relieved from IGNFA to report to their concerned states / organizations.

RUSSIA

Russia is the largest country in the world and holds also largest forest reserves. Russia is one of the most popular countries in the world. The official language is Russian but there are 27 other languages co-official in various regions of the country. The Capital city is Moscow with over 12 million inhabitants and one of the most famous cities globally. Many interesting tourist attractions (e.g. Red Square, Moscow Kremlin, subway etc.) as well as fascinating cultural interests, such as Bolshoi theatre, are in Moscow. Great many world famous authors (such as Tolstoi, Dostojevski, Pushkin and many more) and composers (such as Stravinsky and Rimski-Korsakov, Chaikovskiy) everybody have heard and they come from Russia.

Russian Federation's government is based on a democratic form of rule. The president is chosen in direct elections, and current president is Vladimir Putin and prime-minister is Dmitriy Medvedev. Russia is big producer of oil and natural gas.

Things to keep in mind:

- **Temperature** in July varies a lot, ranging between 5-30°C. Some rains are also possible at this time of the year.
- Language: official language is Russian (Cyrillic alphabet). There are 35 different languages which are considered official languages in various regions of Russia, along with Russian. There are over 100 minority languages spoken in Russia today
- Day-light hours in Moscow in July, sun rises around 3:50 and sets at 21:00.
- Safety in Moscow. As a capital is very touristic place. Obviously there are pickpockets near the main tourist attractions. So look for your belongings, don't put your wallet or documents in the front pocket of your shirt or in the back pocket of your trousers.
- **Passport and migration card.** Please keep your passport and given migration card at passport control all the times when being out from the hotel.
- **Cosmos Hotel** location in the northern part of Moscow on Peace avenue bld. 150. It has over 1700 rooms on 25 floors; 5 restaurants (veg options available), pub, night club, pharmacy, gym and swimming pool (not included into room price), currency exchange, souvenir shops, beauty, spa saloon etc.
- **Police officers** patrolling the centre mostly speak or at least understand English. Hopefully you won't need their assistance
- **Food and drinks**: it is not advisable to drink water from the tap. Please buy bottled water. Water could be refilled from cooler (heat/cold water for drinking) next to the elevator in the Cosmos hotel. Food normally have high hygienic standards.
- Electricity: Electricity is 220V (230V), 50 Hz. Plugs are two-pin continental size.
- **Tipping:** Tipping is not restricted, but you do not have to tip unless you want too, until now is totally voluntary.
- Shops are open from 7 am to 23 pm, however some shops are operating 7/24. In some of the shops it might be possible to pay only by cash.

- **Smoking**: The non-smoking policy became very strict in Russia in last 5-7 years, meaning that smoking is prohibited in all public facilities (schools, busses, bus stops, shopping malls etc.). Cafés, bars and restaurants are also smoke free.
- **Health** No vaccinations or inoculations are required before arrival in general, however in some regions there is hepatitis, HIV etc.
- Currency in Russia is ruble. The best rates for exchanging foreign currency at Cosmos airport (they accept € and USD for exchange). Master Card, Visa and Maestro are accepted in hotels, restaurants, larger shops, and department stores. Visa Electron is also accepted in many shops and department stores. American Express, Diner's Club, Eurocard, Access have limited acceptance in the shops and hotels. Usually you can pay with credit/debit card in bigger shops, train, coffee shops etc. 1 ruble ≈ 1.17 INR, 10 rubles ≈ 11.73 INR
- **Time**. The Russian time is three hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time GMT+3. The time is not changed throughout the year.
- **People** under 40 mostly speak English quite well and you can always ask for directions. You might feel like people are a bit grumpy here, that's true, but most of them will be glad to help a tourist. In restaurants and bars you should find an English-speaking person without any problems.
- **WI-FI and phone connection.** Wireless internet connection could be found from hotel for free and in many public places. Getting Russian mobile phone sim card is complicated, since it requires registration and long awaiting time.

FINLAND

Finland is one of the northernmost countries in European Union. A peninsula with the Gulf of Finland to the south and the Gulf of Bothnia to the west, the country has land borders with Sweden to the northwest, Norway to the north, and Russia to the east. Estonia is south of the country across the Gulf of Finland. Finland's population is 5.5 million (2014), and the majority of the population is concentrated in the southern region.

Near the city of Rovaniemi, **Arctic Circle** is a circle of latitude that runs 66°33'45.9" north of the equator are the major attraction in Finland. It marks the southernmost latitude where the sun can stay continuously below or above the horizon for 24 hours – these phenomena are known as the Midnight Sun in the summer and the Polar Night ("Kaamos") in the winter. Santa Claus officially resides in a house built right on the Arctic circle, near the northern town of Rovaniemi in Lapland

Finland is a parliamentary republic with a central government based in the capital Helsinki, local governments in 317 municipalities, and an autonomous region, the Åland Islands. Current president is Sauli Niinistö from National Coalition Party. The current Prime Minister is Juha Sipilä of the Centre Party.

Things to keep in mind:

- **Temperature** 10°- 30°C the lowest in winter and +30°C the highest in summer; no storms, no floods, no earth quakes, no sandstorms.
- **Day-light hours** during the summer season are between 24 and 20 hours depending on how north in Finland we go, similarly during winter day-light hours vary between 0 to 5 hours
- In mid July, sun rises around 04:00 and sets at 22:45.
- **Finnish society** is a welfare society and together with Sweden is the most competitive country in EU and well ahead of USA (e.g. innovations, new technology, university and business cooperation) (World Economic Forum)
- **Food and drinks:** You can drink the tap water in all Finnish towns and villages; it's very clean and delicious. Finnish food is of a very high hygiene standard.
- **Health** No vaccinations or inoculations are required before arrival. Finland is one of Europe's safest countries in terms of health and hygiene.
- Houses have central-heating, inside temperature around 21 C
- Electricity: Electrical current in Finland is 220V (230V), 50 Hz. Plugs are two-pin continental size.
- **Tipping:** A service fee is automatically included in restaurant and hotel prices/bills. Cafés, hairdressers or taxi-drivers do not expect tips.
- Local language is Finnish but most people can speak some English
- Hardly any snakes or insects that are poisonous
- Public service: advanced health care, public transportation, police, taxies, and post services
- Public security: the Finnish society is quite safe and people are very friendly
- TAX REFUND: Anyone permanently resident outside the EU and Norway can shop tax free in Finland, thus saving about 12 (max. 16) per cent on purchases of over 40 €. Only stores with "tax free shopping" signs will provide customers with a special receipt covering the VAT refund; this can be cashed upon leaving the last EU country visited.
- Most **shops** are open until 6 pm or 9 pm on weekdays and close between 3 pm and 9 pm on Saturdays. Some are open also on Sundays, while others are closed

- **Currency** in Finland is € Euro as in most European Union member states. American Express, Diner's Club, Eurocard, Access, Master Card and Visa are accepted in hotels, restaurants, larger shops, and department stores. Visa Electron is also accepted in many shops and department stores. Usually you can pay with Visa card almost everywhere including taxi, bus, train, coffee shops etc.
